#### From the Pastor:

"At this time of year we have so much to be grateful for and find our hearts full of gratitude. In the words of the late Thomas Merton, "There is no neutrality between gratitude and ingratitude." To be grateful is to recognize the Love of God in everything He has given us – and He has given us everything. Every breath we draw is a gift of His love, every moment of existence is grace for it brings with it immense grace from Him!

#### Comments on Tithing from the pews:

For me, one benefit of tithing is that for the first time ever I now budget how to spend the resources God Provides. Receiving a once – a – month pension was, in the past, a problem. I'd spend much of the money at the beginning of the month, and then try to meet my end of month obligations (at times borrowing on my credit cards). Tithing has helped me to budget carefully... to plan in advance to meet my obligations each month. I now write out all of the month's checks when my pension arrives, then hold the checks for use at the appropriate times. The *first* checks each month are for Sacred Heart: 5% for each weekly offertory collection plus an additional amount (from the other 5%) for any other collections.

**Pope Benedict XVI reflects on sixty years of priestly ministry.** On Wednesday, June 29, 2011 Pope Benedict XVI celebrated Mass marking the feast of the Saints Peter and Paul, patron saints of the city of Rome. During the Eucharistic celebration, the Pope also conferred the Pallium on 41 new Metropolitan archbishops, from countries all over the world, who have been appointed over the past year. In his homely Pope Benedict said that sixty years from his ordination, he can still hear the words that were addressed to the new young priests that day in 1951, the words of St. John's Gospel, "I no longer call you servants but friends." Words, the Pope added, that bring great inner joy and can also be seen as the entire programme of a priestly life. "Friendship is not just about knowing someone, it is above all a communion of the will... Reflecting on the meaning of that friendship with Christ, the pope said it is above all learning to grow in ever greater conformity with his will, to know him better through the scriptures, through prayer, through the

communion of Saints. Jesus' words on friendship, he said, should be seen in the context of his commission to His followers to go and make disciples of all nations – a command which challenges us to move beyond the boundaries of our own world and to bring the Gospel to all people. Pope Benedict concluded with heartfelt words of thanks to the Lord for the past six decades of his own service to the Church, as well as thanks to all the people who, he said have formed and accompanied me. In addition to his sixty years of ordination, Pope Benedict XVI also made a Historic TWEET the very same day! Pope Benedict announced the launch of the newly updated Vatican Website by TWEETING from his IPAD, his TWEET said "*Dear Friends, I just launched news.va Praised be our Lord Jesus Christ! **The Roman Missal, Third Edition**, the ritual text containing prayers and instructions for the celebration of the Mass, is now being prepared for publication. The *Roman Missal* will be implemented in the United States of America on the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011.

Pope John Paul II announced a revised version of the *Missale Romanum* during the Jubilee Year 2000. Among other things, the revised edition of the *Missale Romanum* contains prayers for the observances of recently canonized saints, additional prefaces for the Eucharistic Prayers, additional Votive Masses and Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions, and some updated and revised rubrics (instructions) for the celebration of the Mass. The English translation of the Roman Missal will also include updated translations of existing prayers, including some of the well-known responses and acclamations of the people.
