

Pastor's Column

TALENT AND TIME

Both parishes are in the middle of time and talent (parish volunteering) campaigns this weekend. Sacred Heart had wonderful speakers last week, with cards being filled out in the pews now. St. Jude hears the talks this weekend, with cards filled out next weekend.

Apologies to JFK, but here goes: Ask not what your parish can do for you. Ask what you can do for your parish.

It's so true. Every priest knows this: When that loved one gets married or dies, the parish is there for

them. The priest is there (and often makes a bereavement visit to the home or has many office meetings with the engaged couple). The organist, choir or cantor, altar servers are all there for them. The lights are on, the heat is on, because the utility bills are paid.

And then the family comes into the church for the funeral or the wedding. Most are non-practicing. They haven't darkened the door of the church for years nor put anything in the collection basket on a regular basis, even after being raised in the Faith; sometimes even after Catholic school training. Following the liturgy, they go home and maybe never return. But the Church was there for them.

Many today say that they are against organized religion. "I'm spiritual but not religious," is the mantra. But when Grandma dies or their daughter wants to get married, honey, let's call the church.

What if it all wasn't available? Don't think it couldn't happen. Many Catholic churches have closed around the nation in recent decades. If all the lapsed Catholics in the surrounding neighborhoods had returned to regular Sunday attendance, many of those churches would probably be opened today. Remember, only about 30 per cent of Catholics in the U.S. now attend weekend Mass (down from 75-80 per cent up to 1970).

And so, what if there was no priest or church building available? Here, there is. But who makes that possible? The grace of God, of course, and you, the people of the parish, do. I am very grateful for your support and generosity because you make available the services of the Church not only to our own but to the wider public. St. Jude held a flu clinic for the Juniata County last weekend. Sacred Heart does a monthly lunch for anybody who shows up.

It is what you put in the collection basket and what you do in time and talent that makes possible the services of Jesus Christ offered to the world. I don't mind giving to those who don't give back because that is what we are supposed to do. That is what our Lord and Savior did. And we do it in love.

Juniata Valley Catholic churches operate under the theme of Stewardship. A steward is a caretaker or a servant, taking care of what has been entrusted to him. The principles are the giving of time, talent, and treasure.

Treasure is tithing, i.e., giving 10 per cent of gross household income back to God (5 per cent to the parish; 5 per cent to other charities – and you get to keep the remaining 90 per cent!). Time is time for prayer, every day; Morning Prayer and Nighttime Prayer and maybe an extra time during the day.

Talent is volunteering. No parish can exist without it. The staff can't do it all. Be generous and do for your parish, thus enabling what the parish is doing for others.
