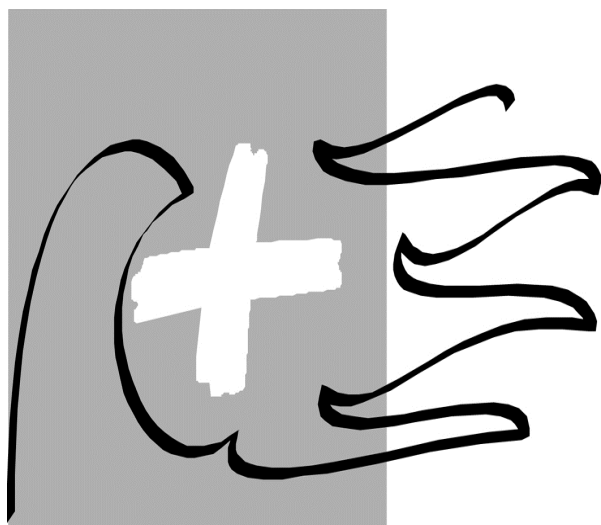
## FINANCIAL COLUMN


